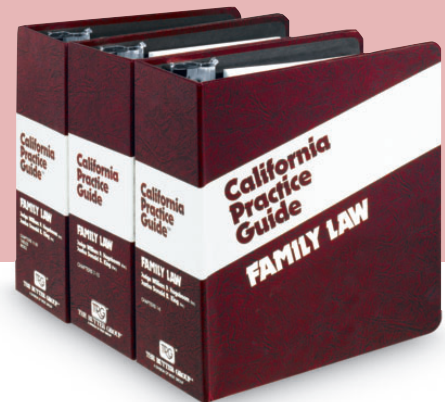

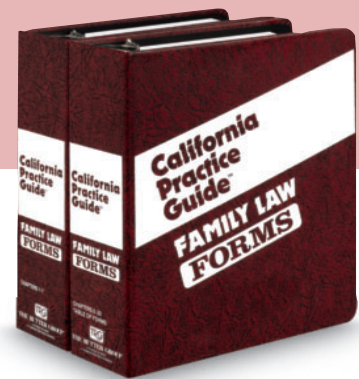

PROGRAM FACULTY



JUDGE THOMAS TRENT LEWIS (Program Director) is the Supervising Judge in the Los Angeles Superior Court Family Law Department. Judge Lewis became a Certified Family Law Specialist in 1985 and was inducted into the American Academy of Matrimonial Lawyers (AAML) in 1987. He served on the Family Law and Juvenile Advisory Commission until 2014 and is a faculty member for the judicial training committee for Family Law. He is immediate past president of the California Chapter of the Association of Family and Conciliation Courts. He is also a contributing author of The Rutter Group's *California Practice Guide: Family Law* and serves as Program Director for CFLR. In 2010, he was awarded the *Outstanding Jurist Award* by AAML's Southern California Chapter, and in 2014, he became the first emeritus member of the Association of Certified Family Law Specialists. In 2015, he received the Los Angeles County Bar Association Family Law Section *Spencer Brandeis Award*, the highest honor bestowed by them.



MICHAEL ASIMOW is a visiting professor at Stanford Law School and Professor of Law Emeritus at UCLA Law School. He teaches income tax, contracts and administrative law. Mr. Asimow is the author of the tax materials in The Rutter Group's *California Practice Guide: Family Law*. He is also the lead author of The Rutter Group's *California Practice Guide: Administrative Law*.



JUSTICE DENNIS A. CORNELL was a trial lawyer for 20 years, a Superior Court judge for nine years, and recently retired from the 5th District Court of Appeal after fifteen years. He became a CFLS in 1980 and a fellow of the AAML in 1982. He has also served in the Family Law Division as the Assistant Supervising Judge and Supervising Judge. In 2016, Judge Gordon was selected by the Chief Justice of California to serve as a member of the Judicial Council of California. He is currently serving as a voting member of the Judicial Council. In 2017, the Chief Justice of California appointed him as a member of the Chief Justice's special working group on Bail and Pretrial Detention Reform. In January 2019, the State Department of the United States invited him to serve as a member of the International Network of Hague Convention Judges.



RONALD S. GRANBERG, CFLS, has been a Certified Family Law Specialist since 1987 and was President of the Association of Certified Family Law Specialists in 2006. He is a member of the American Academy of Matrimonial Lawyers and the International Academy of Matrimonial Lawyers.
